2015 Affordable Housing Bond Update

- \$310M bond passed in November 2015
- First Issuance: \$75.1M
 - Issued October 2016
 - 99% spent as of June 2024
- Second issuance: \$142.1M
 - Issued May 2018
 - 99% spent as of June 2024
- Third issuance: \$92.8M
 - Issued October 2019
 - 97% spent as of June 2024
- Full expenditure projected by mid-2025

Affordable Housing GO Bonds 2016 Preservation and Seismic Safety (PASS) Program Update

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1992 Prop A (SSLP)

- Prop A to fund seismic safety loans after Loma Prieta earthquake passed in 1992
- \$350M bond known as the Seismic Safety Loan Program (SSLP)
 - \$60M for Deferred Loans
 - \$90M for Below Market Rate Loans
 - \$200M for Market Rate Loans
- Program was underutilized only \$90M in loans originated over more than 20 years
- Reframed with additional eligible housing uses in 2016 Prop A.

Updated Eligible Uses

- Seismic retrofits to unreinforced masonry buildings,
- Acquisition/rehabilitation and preservation of affordable housing
- Small Sites (buildings with 5-40 units)
- Larger multi-unit and mixed-use residential buildings
- Single-room occupancy hotels (SRO)

What's not eligible:

- New construction
- Acquisition without rehabilitation

2016 Affordable Housing Bond update

- First Issuance: \$74.4M
 - Issued February 2019
 - 98% spent as of June 2024
- Second issuance: \$102.6M
 - Issued November 2020
 - 64% spent and encumbered as of June
 2024
- We are laying the groundwork now to move forward with the 3rd issuance, which is sensitive to the interest rate environment.

2016 **Affordable** Housing **Bond Anticipated** Units **Preserved**

1,325 units preserved by the first two issuances

- 1,269 residential units
- 56 commercial units

Affordable Housing GO Bonds 2019 Update

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2019 Affordable Housing Bond Update

- **\$600M** bond passed in November 2019
- First Issuance: \$254.1M
 - Issued March 2021
 - 90% spent as of June 2024
- Second Issuance: \$170.0M
 - Issued April 2023
 - 53% spent as of June 2024
 - Balance is mainly in the Public Housing category for Sunnydale and Potrero.

3,270 is the current affordable unit production target funded by the first two issuances

- 744 units complete
- 1,131 units in construction
- 1,395 units in predevelopment

Affordable Housing GO Bonds 2019 3rd Issuance Request

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2019 Affordable Housing Bond Proposed 3rd Issuance Low-income housing

- \$35.3M in Low-income Housing for 1515 S Van Ness gap funding
 - Supports 168 units including 42 units set aside for households experiencing homelessness.
 - Tenants are expected to move in by the end of 2026.

2019 Affordable Housing Bond Proposed 3rd Issuance Middle-income housing

- **\$6.4M** in **Middle-income Housing** for downpayment assistance loan program
 - Will continue the successful downpayment assistance loan program for first-time homebuyers.
 - Average downpayment assistance amount is approximately \$425K per household.
 - Supports moderate income borrowers, 120%-175% AMI
 - Deferred loan due upon sale, transfer of the property, or non-compliance with contractual requirements.

2019 **Affordable** Housing **Bond** Proposed 3rd Issuance **Senior housing**

- **\$5.2M** in **Senior Housing** for gap funding at 967 Mission
 - Construction is expected to begin in mid 2026 with tenant move ins expected in 2028.



2019 Affordable Housing Bond Proposed 3rd Issuance Educator housing

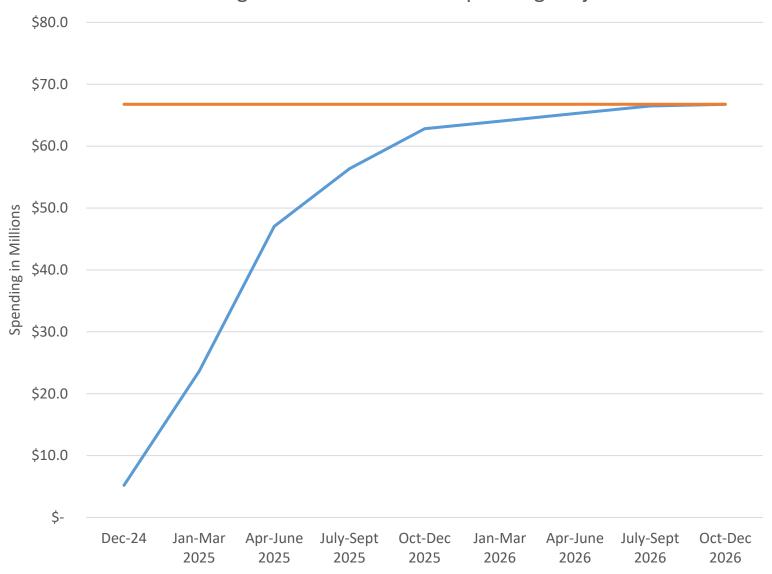
- **\$19.8M** in **Educator Housing** for 750 Golden Gate
 - Supports 75 units for SF Unified School District and SF Community College District employees.

2024 Affordable Housing Bond Proposed 1st Issuance Low-income housing

• \$87M in Low-income Housing

- Sunnydale Block 7 and Block 9 supporting 89 and 95 units, respectively. Estimated completion in summer 2027.
- Balboa Reservoir Building A and Building E supporting 159 and 124 units, respectively. Both projects are currently in predevelopment.

2024 Affordable Housing Bond Proposed 1st Issuance Preservation

• \$30M in Affordable Housing Preservation

- Represents issuance of the entire authorized amount.
- Permanent loan fundings for two locations.

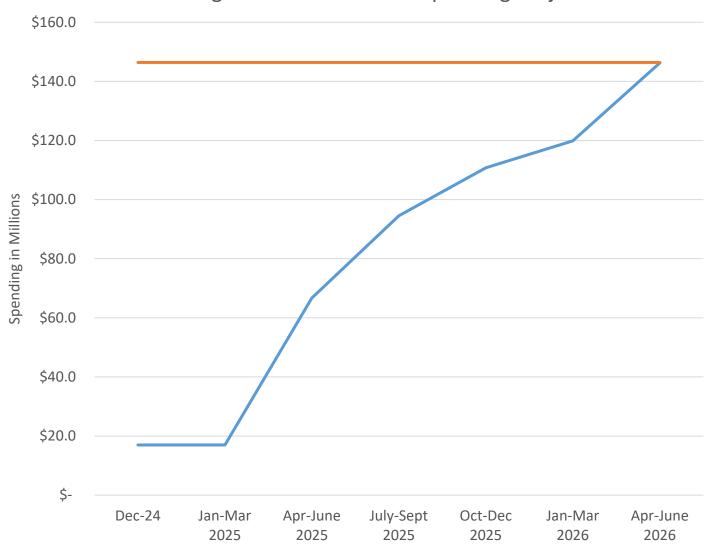
- \$30M in Victims and Survivors housing
